Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0

All students who want to take Dual Credit courses are required to take the TSIA2 and meet the score requirements prior to being enrolled in Dual Credit courses.

The Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0 (TSIA2) was instituted by the Texas Legislature and is a program of diagnostic testing and developmental instruction designed to improve student success rates in Texas colleges. Entering college students are required to meet established minimum standards on assessment tests in math, reading, and writing.

Most of the time the TSIA2 will be administered at Zephyr ISD.

On Testing Day, students will need to bring the following items on testing day to their campus:

- Certificate of Completion for the Pre-Assessment Activity (completed prior to testing)
- Photo ID

Students will not be allowed to have their cell phone or any other personal belongings during the test. Calculators are NOT ALLOWED

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit allows a high school student to earn college credit and high school credit concurrently.

Will the credits transfer?

Most of the credits earned will transfer to other colleges or universities. It is the students' responsibility to make sure that the Dual Credits earned will transfer to another college or university.

What is a Dual Credit passing grade?

Credit will be awarded for high school credit for a 70 average or better for the semester. For example, if a dual credit semester grade is 98, a 98 will be recorded on the student's transcript with the corresponding course.

What happens if I earn lower than a 70 in a course?

Student will not be allowed to enroll in dual credit the following semester in that subject area. Also, the student may not be eligible for dual credit courses the year following failing a dual credit course.

Why does Zephyr High School care if I earn a C in a course?

It is the expectation of Zephyr High School for students to be college ready. It is not beneficial for students to earn low grades since this affects both high school GPA and class rank as well as college GPA. A low GPA could negatively affect both college acceptance as well as scholarship opportunities.

Who can take Dual Credit courses?

Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors who have met the TSIA2 college readiness requirements by earning a college readiness score on the TSIA2 Assessment OR meeting one of the TSIA2 exemptions may register for Dual Credit courses.

How much does Dual Credit cost and when do I pay?

The current cost for Ranger College dual credit courses is \$75 per semester hour. This cost is subject to change. The Zephyr ISD will pay for courses and textbooks for students earning an A or B. However, students will be responsible for paying for the course if the grade is below a B.

What is the deadline for turning in required paperwork to take Dual Credit courses?

All required paperwork must be completed and turned in to the Zephyr High School counseling office by the last day of the school year.

How will my college class affect my high school schedule and GPA?

Dual Credit courses are weighted and will be figured into the student's GPA at the end of the semester per ZISD local Board policy. If a student drops a Dual Credit course with a failing grade or fails the course in the fall, the student will be given the college grade or a 50, whichever is higher. A student who fails a Dual Credit course will not be allowed to enroll in any other Dual Credit courses the following semester. Future enrollment in Dual Credit courses will be at the discretion of the school administration.

How is a Dual Credit course different from a regular high school course?

All Dual Credit courses for Zephyr ISD are taught by online instructors. Students must be self-motivated and be able to meet deadlines in order to be successful in a Dual Credit course. Dual Credit courses are taught at the pace and rigor of regular college courses. Students will not receive Six Week grades. Students will be able to monitor Dual Credit grades through their Ranger College on line account. Dual Credit students will be expected to conduct themselves as a college student. Students will be responsible for communicating any concerns or questions with Ranger College instructors via email, Blackboard Account, or phone. Zephyr High School staff is not able to change due dates for assignments or dates set for testing. If there is a conflict or problem, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Ranger College instructor prior to the due date to see if other arrangements can be made.

Ranger College Dual Credit - Parent Permission Form

The dual-credit enrollment program at Ranger College requires the following:

- The student must be admitted to Ranger College. Each student must: complete and submit an application for admission. complete and submit the Parent Permission form with all signatures. submit copies of test scores (STAAR, TSI, PSAT, PLAN, ACT, SAT).
- 2. The student must have completed the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) for the appropriate subject and must have tested in all three areas if not exempted by STAAR, ACT or SAT scores.
- 3. Payment must be submitted to Ranger College at the time designated by RC officials.
- 4. The signatures on this form give the high school permission to send to Ranger College all required test scores as well as final transcripts upon graduation.
- 5. The signatures also give Ranger College permission to release the student's academic record to the high school until such time as the student is no longer enrolled at that school.
- 6. The signatures on this form also give Ranger College permission to release the student's academic record to the parent(s) upon request until such time as the student is no longer enrolled at that school unless the student rescinds this permission by completing the section below.
